→ **Foodshare**- State program that helps people with limited money buy the food they need. → <u>McKinney Vento</u>- Federal funding for homeless youth to receive educational benefits. <u>https://dpi.wi.gov/homeless/liaisons#m</u>. → <u>Medicaid-</u> Health insurance that is funded primarily by the federal government and run at the state level. Includes coverage for some low-income people, families and children, pregnant women,
