Point in Time Count of Homelessness (PIT) Overview

What is Point in Time (PIT)?

- A snapshot of people experiencing homelessness on a given night
- Provides the number of individuals and demographic information
- Conducted across the communities in the United States during the last week of January
- Conducted by Madison/Dane County Continuum of Care (CoC) on the fourth Wednesday of January each year
- Used to measure and monitor trends and changes in homelessness on local and national levels

Who are counted in the PIT?

Sheltered Count

- Emergency shelters (including those using hotel and motel vouchers)
- Transitional housing
- Safe Havens

Reports from the shelters and TH

Unsheltered Count


- Car
- Park
- Abandoned building
- Bus or train station
- Airport
- Camping ground
- Parking Lot

PIT overnight teams and post count teams

NOTE: PIT does NOT include people experiencing at risk of homelessness, doubled-up homelessness, people on shelter waitlists, or individuals in institutions.

- Families: Persons in households with at least one adult and one child



Dane County Population by Household Type








