Broadly, The Salvation Army offers shelter for a myriad of populations, transitional housing, multiple Rapid Rehousing programs, Diversion services, healthcare (i.e. medical, dental, mental health clinics), and coordinated entry.

A large component of service delivery is case management, which includes the proposed Rapid Rehousing program. One full time case manager will be tasked with housing location and support services for the participants in the program. This case manager will have a minimum bachelor’s degree in a social service related field. Case management activities are directly supervised by an agency supervisor who have a master’s degree in social work. Case management is offered, at minimum, once a week.

The Salvation Army’s Executive Director of Social Services and Contract Administrator will manage grant-related activities for this project. Contract Administrator and Divisional Headquarters compiles budget information and manages disbursements. Additionally, staff enters clients into HMIS to enter and monitor statistics for program effectiveness.

The Salvation Army of Dane County (TSA) receives funds from varied sources, including federal. TSA has effectively managed HUD-funded contracts which support RISE (RRH) for the past 8 years and have administered CoC-funded grants for at least 16 years. Further, The Salvation Army receives EHH funds for medical shelter, Family shelter case management, Women’s Shelter Case management, and a family and singles Rapid Rehousing program.

TSA has demonstrated an ability to effectively budget, spend funds on eligible underperformance, communicate with funders, document and submit reports in accordance with funding regulations.

2. Describe your organization’s (and subrecipient(s) if applicable) experience in leveraging Federal, State, local and private sector funds.

The Salvation Army (TSA) has experience both matching and leveraging funds appropriately and adequately as specified by funders. As a participating agency within the CoC application process. TSA takes diligent care to ensure that funds (cash and in-kind) are uniquely matched or leveraged, not both.

3. Describe your organization's (and subrecipient(s) if applicable) financial management structure.

The Salvation Army of Dane County (TSA) is led by Major Andrew Shiels. Day-to-day operation is largely autonomous, but guided by policies, procedures and principles set forth by TSA Divisional Headquarters. The social services department, the umbrella under which Hearts of Hope will sit, is teamed with Executive Director of Social services, Assistant Director of Social Services, Shelter Manager, Housing Director, case managers and shelter advocates. Housing Directors directly oversees case managers and their daily activity; Shelter Managers directly oversees shelter operations and staff. TSA's Business Administrator and Executive Director of Social Services review financial figures monthly to track contractual compliance. Further, TSA's accounting systems and financial reporting is reviewed annually via internal audit by TSA Divisional Headquarters. TSA of Dane County undergoes an external audit annually by PKF Mueller. The financial statements of TSA are prepared in accordance with the national accounting policies of The Salvation Army. These policies are consistent with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Agency-wide communication and coordination is essential to meeting community needs most efficiently. Management staff regularly assemble to share information, identify gaps, create solutions, strategically plan, etc. Within the social services department, shelter and case management functions are largely interdependent. For example, supervisors, shelter staff and case managers participate together in staff meetings. Shelter staff and case managers, alike, discuss the strengths, challenges and goals of a family from distinctly different perspectives, which provides for a rich discussion and synchronized action steps. Coordination extends beyond the walls of TSA. TSA participates in our community's Coordinated Intake. Case managers coordinate with a host of community-wide providers including Community Action Coalition, Porchlight, YWCA, local churches, MMSD/TEP, Joining Forces for Families, Access Community Health, Journey Mental Health, DAIS, local landlords, etc. We are also a member of the Homeless Services Consortium, Shelter Provider's Committee, Coordinated Intake Committee, Point in Time Committee, and the Mainstream Resources Committee. Further, TSA has collaborative projects with The Road Home, YWCA, United Way, City of Madison and Dane County.

3B. Project Description

1. Provide a description that addresses the entire scope of the proposed project.

The Salvation Army (TSA) is proposing to start the Hearts of Hope (H&H) Rapid Rehousing program using the DV bonus funds. The program will utilize the housing first model, providing survivor driven, trauma informed advocacy and housing assistant to assist survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence or stalking to provide them with tools and resources to lift them from homelessness to stable housing.

TSA will provide 10 (or more) scattered-site, appropriate and affordable apartment units for households experiencing homelessness and DV.

The Alexander Company (TAC) is a partner management company operating The Shield Apartments. The Shield is a new construction containing 44 units: TSA will designate 33 of the units as supportive units comprising of 22 units for survivors of domestic violence & 11 units for applicants with 60% AMI or less. All of these units are privately funded & would not be using federal dollars.

TSA and TAC have come together to decrease the tenant screening criteria that is often used to screen out applications in our community. By doing so, we will be able to rapidly rehouse participants & connect them to housing stabilization and other wrap around services.

This partnership with TAC and the new build of The Shield apartments will provide the H&H Rapid Rehousing program with pre-identified units that will be presented as an option for participants that are enrolled in the program. If The Shield units are not available or desired by the individuals in the program than community-based housing will be located.

H&H will work closely with the community’s coordinated intake prioritization list and assessment so as to identify households (via the VI-SPDAT) most suitable for rapid rehousing assistance. Program participants will meet HUD’s definition of homelessness and actively work in concert with a CM. Per HUD’s rapid rehousing program standards, H&H participants will be eligible for rental assistance for no more than 24 months; CM may persist for up to six months after rental assistance stops. The program will measure program success by two goals: 1.) Households will remain in permanent housing at program exit; and 2.) adults will maintain or increase their total income at program exit.

The crux of this project is rooted in comprehensive supportive services which include:

- Intake and Assessment: specific, measurable, attainable, realistic, and timely goals will be collaboratively established based upon the participant’s unique set of needs, strengths, and barriers.
- Housing Location Assistance: CMs and program staff will work with participants to secure safe, affordable housing.
- Intensive CM: a CM will meet face-to-face with the household approximately once a week to work towards established goals, advocate and refer. The frequency and intensity of meetings may lessen over time as the household becomes more self-sufficient.
- Financial Counseling: as part of CM, participants will learn to develop (cash and non-cash) resources, avoid predatory lending, repair credit and budget.
- Rental Assistance: The program will provide up to 24 months of rental assistance based on participants’ needs, including move-in costs.
- Supplementary Assistance: as the budget (non-HUD funds) allows, participants may be assisted with transportation (bus passes and/or gas vouchers), moving

expenses, security, procuring household goods, including furniture & cleaning supplies, ID, etc

After program and apartment acceptance, Heart of Hope (H&H) will provide a rent subsidy (up to 100%) for up to two years. One measure of programmatic success is determined by the number of households who remain in permanent housing (without a subsidy or case management) at program exit. Regular, supportive case management is critical in helping program participants reach this goal. Case Manager will work alongside program participants and draw upon a myriad of supportive services to wraparound the participant such as, but not limited to: Medical/dental/mental health care, substance use treatment, money management tools, parenting skills, vocational/educational instruction, mainstream benefits, commutation skills, housing maintenance tools, etc. Case management and the client-centered goals set forth within will, ultimately, target increased self-sufficiency and independent living. The Salvation Army's matched funds are available to assist with emergency expenses, as well.

2. Describe the specific plan to coordinate and integrate with other mainstream health, social services, and employment programs for which program participants may be eligible.

One program performance measure is focused on the number of adults who maintain or increase their total income at program exit. Program participants' needs will be assessed during the initial intake at which time employment and income (cash and non-cash) will be evaluated. If indicated, case plans will include a goal to increase the number of mainstream benefits participants are enrolled in. Case Manager will work with the participant on setting smaller goals with a specific timeline so as to achieve the receipt of entitlement benefits within six months of program start. Similarly, barring disability, a goal(s) will be set with regard to employment and training, education and/or job readiness. Participants will choose one of these three tracks to undertake (smaller manageable goals will be set in accordance with the chosen track) and/or obtain employment over 12 months. All cash and non-cash benefits, including baseline figures and quarterly interim reviews, will be recorded in HMIS.
